Feeding Herbs to Your Horse

Our powdered herbal blends can be fed by mixing with your horse's feed and adding a small amount of water or apple cider vinegar to bind it to the feed.

Alternatively, you can mix the dose with enough water to make about 60ml of tea and administer with a dosing syringe.

Feed herbs for 6 days a week, with one day of rest.

K2 is a blend of herbs with properties that are known protect and detoxify the kidneys. It is especially useful after antibiotic treatments, which stress the kidneys.



K2 contains the following herbs (materia medica):

Dandelion Root: diuretic, hepatic, alterative, cholagogue, tonic Astragalus Root: immunomodulator, hematonic, cardiotonic, diuretic, hypotensive Marshmallow Root: demulcent, vulnerary, diuretic, alterative, emollient Parsley: diuretic, antimicrobial, stimulant

Ginger Root: circulation stimulant, diaphoretic, anti-inflammatory, antiplatelet Licorice Root: adaptogen, antiviral, anti-inflammatory

Definitions:

- adaptogen helps the body adapt to stress and exerts a normalizing effect on bodily processes
- alterative tending to alter favorably the course of an ailment
- anti-inflammatory reduces inflammation
- antimicrobial an agent that kills microorganisms or stops their growth
- antiplatelet prevents blood clots
- antiviral an agent that kills a virus, or inhibits its ability to replicate
- cardiotonic supports heart function helps circulation
- cholagogue promotes discharge of bile
- circulation stimulant stimulates circulation
- demulcent relieves inflammation and irritation to mucous membranes by forming a soothing film
- diaphoretic warming, increases perspiration
- diuretic increases the output of urine
- emollient softens or soothes the skin
- hematonic acting to increase the amount of hemoglobin in the blood
- hepatic strengthens or supports liver function
- hypotensive lowers tension
- immunomodulator modifies the immune response or functioning of the immune system
- tonic substance that produces vigor or well-being
- vulnerary of use in the healing of wounds
